The college make all efforts to equip the students with relevant knowledge, skills, abilities with a special stress on the value of humanism and nationalism. In the last decades, the college has proved its worth not only in the field of academics, but also outshine in different co-curricular activities. The college has maintained a calm atmosphere best suited for ideal learning and exercises beyond the prescribed syllabus and prepare student teachers for future responsibilities in real life situations with confidence. The college have special focus on personality development, fine tuning of interpersonal skills and learning the art of teaching.

The college has modern infrastructure, number of spacious and airy classrooms, well equipped library and having elibrary facility with Wi-Fi zone. College has fully air-conditioned ICT and Media Resource Centre with printers and internet facility, where student teacher learns latest skills of teaching, they are trained using smart boards with the help of micro teaching,

Seminars, workshops, discussions and orientation programs are organized time to time to update the student teachers through expertise of eminent speakers and guest lecturers. #### **FEE-STRUCTURE**

Fee /funds as per the Panjab University Chandigarh and S.C.E.R.T Punjab/Punjab State

#### **FINES/DUES**

- Absence fine Rs. 20/- per day, without information
- Absence from Morning Assembly Rs. 10/- per assembly
- Uniform fine Rs. 20/- per day
- Absence from Tutorials/Seminar and House meeting Rs.50/- per day
- Absence from House Examination Rs. 100/- per exam.

- Absence from College Functions Rs. 100/- per day
- Re-admission Rs. 500/-
- Special fine for the misconduct etc. will depend upon the nature of the offence and may even lead to rustication.

#### Note:-

- No students will be allowed to attend the classes till the payment of dues/fine.
- Any student found absent for 7 days continuously, will be struck off from the College rolls and re-admission will take place only on payment of Rs. 500/-.
- The candidate who fails to deposit the fees in time and thus misses his/her chance for admission and will have no further claim for admission.
- If any student does not attend the college within a week from the opening day (as announced by the college) his/her admission will stand cancelled.
- Students from other Universities will have to submit their migration certificates within 30 days of their admission to the college.
- Students admitted under SC. /ST. Category will have to submit their original SC. / ST. Certificate at the time of admission. In the absence of certificate admission will stand cancelled.
- A late-fee of Rs. 50/- per day shall be charged if fees are not paid by due dates.

#### **RULES FOR TAKING LEAVE**

• Leave must be got sanctioned personally and leave application must be signed by the parents/guardian. In case of illness, the application should be accompanied by a medical certificate issued by a medical officer.

#### **RULES FOR THE ISSUE OF BOOKS**

- No student is permitted to enter the library without his/her identity-cum-library card.
- The student issued 2 books issued for 14 days. A fine of Rs. 10/- per day will be charged after the due date.
- A book issued can be recalled anytime by the librarian.
- In case of loss/damage of books borrowed, a student shall be liable to pay the cost of the book lost or defaced/damaged.
- Students are expected to observe silence in the library.
- Students shall keep their belongings at the library entrance with the library attendant.
- The library will be closed once a year for stock checking. All the books borrowed must be returned as notified by the Principal/Librarian.

#### **RULES REGARDING PAYMENT OF HOSTEL CHARGES**

- The amount of security is refundable/adjustable as and when the student leaves the hostel or the mess is closed permanently.
- In case a student teacher does not pay the hostel charges by the due date, it shall be the responsibility of the Warden to ensure that such student does not continue to stay / reside in the hostel.
- Once admitted to the hostel, he/she have to pay the hostel rent/dues.
- In order to vacate the hostel accommodation, the student teacher is required to obtain the prior permission of the Principal/Warden and send a prior intimation to the college office. If the name of the student is struck off due to non-payment of hostel dues, he/she may be allowed for re-admission with the approval of Principal.

#### **RULES FOR HOUSE EXAMINATION**

- It is compulsory for all student teachers to appear in house examinations as well as class tests held by the college.
- Exemption from the house examination/class test on account of serious illness or any cogent reason is to be secured from the Principal before the commencement of such examination/class test. Application for permission for exemption should be supported by Medical Certificate bearing the signature of the Parents. No application will be entertained after the

examination is over.

- Absence or leave from an examination for whatever reason means nil result and will penalized heavily.
- A student found guilty of unfair means or misbehavior during the examination will be viewed seriously. He/she will be fined Rs. 200/-on each occasion.
- The Principal may at his discretion hold a special test for those who failed to fulfill the conditions prescribed by the Panjab University to take the annual university examination.

#### **CANTEEN**

The college well-furnished campus canteens separately for boys and girls. Both the canteens are inspected daily by the college Resident Medical Officer for the maintenance of proper cleanliness and hygienic conditions. The rate of various articles is fixed by the college authorities. The rate list is displayed at its cash counter. The students are advised to visit the college canteen for light refreshment and meals. Purchases from shops outside the college campus should be discouraged. There is separate seating arrangement for students and members of the staff.

#### **CAREER GUIDANCE & COUNSELING CELL**

The Career and Guidance Cell is established to guide the students and parents about various opportunities available to them in this age of globalization. Every effort is made to make all information available to the students regarding various courses, competitions etc. Placement Cell of the college makes an endeavor to place the students of the college in various fields of teaching. Special efforts are made to organize the interaction of the students with heads of various schools and colleges through placement cell.

#### **COUNTING OF LECTURES**

The counting of lectures shall be from the date of first lecture delivered. For theory classes 75% and for practical classes 90% will be entertain to appear 85% of the total lectures is compulsory for all the students.

#### **GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT**

#### Student teachers are not allowed to :-

- Involve in any activity that does defame the Institution.
- Indulgence in activities like strike-work or anti-raging and anti-disciplinary act/encourage other students.
- Deface the college walls, desks, benches and black boards is strictly prohibited.
- Wander aimlessly in the corridors/verandas as it hinders the learning process.
- Use Mobile Phones during college hours. Violators will be punished heavily and the mobile phone set will be confiscated.
- Displace the class room furniture and its existing arrangements.
- Arrange any meeting/party, group photo or tour without the prior written permission of the Principal.
- Display any notice or information on the notice board of his/her own without the permission of the Principal or any other competent authority.
- Appear in the examination or promoted to next semester without clearing due and fees.

#### Every student teacher is expected to: -

- Behave nicely and show respect to the teachers and other college officials.
- Maintain the dignity, modesty and simplicity.
- Maintain discipline and decorum in the college campus.
- Be regular and punctual on all occasions.
- Come to the college dressed properly.
